

Community Grants



Since early in the first lockdown the Parish Council and its Committees have been meeting virtually. In line with the legal requirements all of these meetings are open to the public. Details of how to join are included on every agenda. Agendas are still being posted on the noticeboards and on the Council's website.

A few highlights from recent meetings:-

Parish Council:

Grants awarded to Bishop's Waltham in Bloom, Meon Valley Heartstart, St Peter's PCC and Home-Start.

Reviewed the High Street arrangements for COVID-19 secure shopping.

Co-opted a new Councillor – Kevin Jones.

Considered the licence application for the Sainsbury's store.

Finance, Policy & Resources Committee:

Regularly reviewed the financial impact on the Council of COVID-19.

Monitored the progress of the Jubilee Hall car park.

Commenced the budget setting process for 2021/22.

Held meetings with WCC and HCC and other interested parties in regard to a Southern Footpath/Cycleway.

Planning & Highways Committee:

Following the temporary changes to the High Street during the lockdown, the Committee has appointed a Working Group to consider options for permanent traffic management in these areas.

Held a meeting with HCC to consider a location for additional cycle racks in the town (these will be installed next to the bus shelter in the Square).

Held a virtual meeting with Nationwide Platforms and Elliotts to discuss concerns raised by neighbours in the area.

West Hoe Cemetery Management Committee:

A programme of works for clearing and replanting has been adopted.

Publicity for the pet cemetery agreed.

New Footpath Gates

Walkers will be pleased to know that two stiles have been replaced by gates on the network of Rights of Way footpaths in Bishop's Waltham Parish. They are on the boundary of the private property of The Limmers at the boundary of Upham parish. This is a popular route, particularly for those who enjoy slightly longer distances. It is included in two of our walks leaflets, 'Exploring Bishop's Waltham' and 'Pub Walks around Bishop's Waltham'. These can be obtained at The Jubilee Hall or at the map board by the parking ticket machines in the town centre car park. Hampshire County Council Countryside Team provided the gates and Bishop's Waltham Parish Council kindly paid for their installation. We are lucky in Bishop's Waltham in these difficult times to have over 50 Rights of Way footpaths which can give great enjoyment and a feeling of well-being. Please remember that they are all on private land, most of which gives the landowners their livelihoods.

Walkers should keep their dogs under control, stick to the footpaths, avoid livestock and treat the countryside with respect.



Insect Hotel

The Community Development Committee has worked on a project with the town's Men's Shed group to install an Insect Hotel in a hedgerow at Priors Meadow. The Men's Shed group built this amazing structure and positioned it as a very desirable residence for our insect

community in the meadow.

Many thanks are given to the group for their help with this project.

Fritillary Planting

A small team, organised by the Parish Council's Community Development Committee, planted 200 fritillary bulbs at Priors Meadow in early October.

We hope the community enjoy the 'snake head' fritillaries – a beautifully shaped flower once commonly seen in British meadows.

A big thank you to all those who helped with planting.





Remembrance Day

Remembrance Day events were a little different this year.

Before the second lockdown restrictions started, we were able to attend the Dedication of the Garden of Remembrance Service on Wednesday 4th November 2020.

Due to restrictions, the Sunday Remembrance Service from St Peter's was held online only.

Then, at 11am on Tuesday 11th November, to commemorate Remembrance Day, the old air raid siren was sounded in the High Street to begin the two minutes silence. Wreaths were individually placed on the War Memorial by community groups and organisations.



Play Park Resurfacing

Works have been undertaken to repair worn and loose surface edging at play parks.

The council has enhanced the surfaces for children with visual impairments.

The bright yellow edging makes the areas easier to see where the surfacing starts and shows where the landing space is at the end of slides.



Tree Planting

Various trees (including fruit trees) have been ordered and plans are underway for planting in the grass areas at Langton Road/Morley Drive.



Priory Park Skate Park Update

Despite many repairs made over the years, the Skate Park at Priory Park has failed two health and safety inspections.

Unfortunately, it does not conform to current safety standards and the Council has made the decision to remove the dangerous ramps and level the deteriorating concrete base.
