Welcome to the summer edition of Bishop's Waltham Matters, our first newsletter since the Parish Council elections that took place in May. In this newsletter you will find a list of your 14 newly-elected Councillors.

We are pleased to be able to update you regarding the progress of several long-standing projects, it is an exciting time with the construction of a new play area having commenced, and the planning application for the refurbished skatepark having been submitted. We have also received planning permission for the much-needed extension to the overflow car park at Priory Park and we will be inviting tenders in the coming weeks.

In addition, in recent months we have been working to retain a valued community asset, the St John's Ambulance Hall, the location of the Montessori preschool. We have also listed the Parish Council-owned Well House for sale with the Citizens Advice continuing as a sitting tenant to balance the Council's property portfolio.

The Parish Council is beginning the process of looking forward to 2024-2028 to produce a new Forward Plan. We will be considering what we are going to continue to work on and what we hope to build on in the future for the benefit of our residents. 
The contents of the kiosk will be overseen by the Parish Council and will be used to promote news and events from Bishop's Waltham's not-for-profit community organisations.



<u>Community Organisations</u> - If your community organisation needs help to finance a project, grants are available from the Parish Council. All you need is some time to look at the policy and complete the application form and the money could be yours! Winchester City Council and other organisations also have a variety of grant schemes, if you would like more information, ask the Parish Council Office for a summary of funding that might help you.

Parish Council Committees

Finance, Policy & Resources Committee – This Committee works closely with the Council's Finance Manager, providing monthly monitoring of budgets and ensuring that spending is in accordance with financial regulations. Our current areas of focus are completing the purchase of the much-valued community asset (St Johns Ambulance Hall) and the sale of our Well House asset. The Committee also conducts ongoing reviews of the policies that guide the Council's activities. - Cllr Don Iro (Committee Chairman)

Halls & Grounds Committee - This Committee is responsible for the management and maintenance of all Parish Council owned buildings, their carparks, sports and recreation grounds and open spaces. We have several projects well under way such as the Montague Road play area and Skatepark refurbishment covered in this newsletter. Projects currently in the planning stages include renovating and extending the overflow carpark at Priory Park, the installation of an equipped play area at Albany Road and the installation of solar panels at the Jubilee Hall. The Facilities Review will also continue, with the added support of our Project Manager as we consider the sustainability of all our buildings, amenities and sports facilities and how these can be updated and improved for the decades ahead - Cllr Barry Nicholson (Committee Chairman)

Community & Environment Committee - What a great year it has been for community events! We hope to continue these next year by organising further PC events and supporting other community groups wherever possible. Our environmental working group has been meeting regularly and is implementing an action plan to help tackle climate change. We have expanded our communications by starting up an e-Newsletter - please subscribe to ensure you keep up to date. Our grant applications were very well received and we have currently awarded £6,000 to well-deserving community groups. - Cllr Ed Jelf (Committee Chairman)

Planning & Highways Committee - Planning is always an emotive subject, and we ensure that ALL applications are well researched before the meeting and that any members of the public are given the opportunity to explain what and why they need it! We always make sure that ALL applications comply with our Bishop's Waltham statement. Of course, Winchester City Council has the final say on all planning, applications, but hopefully, comments are considered. Montague Road Play Park Update

Following the transferral of the green space at Montague Road to the Parish Council's ownership in 2022, we have been working on the planning and installation of the play areas that were included in the original planning permission for the Montague Road estate.

The Halls and Grounds Committee is delighted to report that in July, work on the site commenced. The first phase involved groundwork to install a drainage system since the ground in this area has historically been very wet during the winter months. Following this preliminary work, the play equipment will then be installed. We hope the children of our community enjoy this wonderful new facility!



Skatepark Refurbishment Update

In spring of this year, public consultation took place regarding the planned skatepark refurbishment. The new designs we received were displayed at the Jubilee Hall and on our website.

A big thank you to everyone who took the time to look at the designs and submit comments.

We are pleased to announce that the design that proved most popular during the consultation was then selected by the Council.

Due to the selected design having a slightly increased footprint to the old facility, a planning application has been submitted to Winchester City Council. We hope to report back on the result soon.
