Bishop's Waltham joined the country in grief at the loss of Her Majesty The Queen, Elizabeth II in September. The Parish Council lowered the flag to half mast at the Jubilee Hall, opened a Book of Condolence and received floral tributes from the community in honour of The Queen. Council meetings were cancelled as the nation entered a period of mourning.

On Proclamation Day, councillors, staff and the community gathered to hear the Proclamation of the Accession of King Charles III, read by the Chairman of the Council, Mrs Judy Marsh.

On the Eve of the Funeral of Her late Majesty Queen Elizabeth II a gathering was held in St Peter's Churchyard for a brief vigil and moment of silent reflection.


