Forward Plan 2019 -2023

Bishop's Waltham Parish Council is responsible for improving the local community and represents the whole electorate within the parish. It delivers services to meet local needs and strives to improve the quality of life for its residents.

The Parish Council has the power to spend money on community transport, traffic calming, crime prevention, youth projects, tourism activities, leisure facilitates, community centres, car parks, recreation grounds, entertainment, street furniture, street cleaning, allotments, bus shelters and land. It comments on planning applications and can be represented at public inquiries. It is likely to be granted more powers to negotiate with the local principal authorities and take on additional responsibilities.

The contents of the Forward Plan 2019-2023 derive from past surveys, continuing projects from the last Plan, and the results of a major survey of residents conducted in 2018.

The Parish Council will break down each project into actions, allocated to committees with a schedule and a budget where necessary. Progress will be publicised in an annual report.

The Parish Council is committed to:

- Listening to concerns, suggestions and providing feedback.
 - Ensuring that actions reflect the community's requirements.
 - Looking to the public for advice, innovations and assistance.

In particular, the Parish Council will welcome direct involvement from committed residents in progressing some of the projects. Anyone wishing to help should initially contact the Council's Executive Officer - Lindsay Edge.

Bishop's Waltham is a great centre for cycling, on the edge of the National Park and surrounded by countryside. The Parish Council Forward Plan includes actions to develop cycling in the community. We are already working with local authorities and organisations to publicise cycling routes locally. Councillors also hear concerns about local cycling safety in our high street surgeries, which we will need to consider in any actions.

We have developed 2 routes locally. One reflects the historic tradition of walking around the parish boundary during Ascension Week. The other is a 20 mile route, much of it off-road, that includes local villages.

The duties of a Parish Lengthsman

On being asked to write a brief description of my duties as a Parish Lengthsman, I looked up the definition. Most of the accounts had the spelling as 'Lengthman' not 'Lengthsman'. It was used in the 1700's to describe a person who looked after a length of road between mile stones. Then with the introduction of canals and railways a Lengthman was employed. Their basic job was to do minor repairs and to maintain drainage, hedges and attend to the wild flowers.

Today's portrayal would be quite a shock to my predecessors, employed in this role. The post itself consists of litter picking, cleaning signage, but not illuminated signs, maintaining street furniture, the upkeep of bus shelters, reporting any defects in road surfaces, blocked drains, abandoned vehicles (including caravans) and fly-tipping. This is just a small portion of what my job entails, as described by Hampshire County Council. Also, I manage work for the Community Payback Scheme, setting tasks and suitable jobs for them to assist me in my role as Parish Lengthsman for Bishops Waltham.

My definition of my position would be a caretaker of the community, so my thanks goes out to those who support and guide me.




A job that goes back to Medieval times, for centuries Lengthsmen were paid to "walk the length of the parish" to keep its ditches and drains clear.
