# **World Car-Free Day**


Plans are afoot to celebrate World Car Free Day in Bishop's Waltham by closing off the whole town centre to traffic on Sunday 22<sup>nd</sup> September 2019. Many towns and cities throughout the country will be doing the same. Community organisations and shops will be encouraged to take advantage of the space available, whilst families and individuals will have the opportunity to play and relax in a quiet, traffic-free and pollution free environment.

The proposed road barriers will be at the following locations:

The Crown roundabout Little Shore Lane (by the Jubilee Hall) Bank Street Lower Lane (Corhampton Road end)

There will be free access around the town centre via Shore Lane, Free Street, Corhampton Road and the Winchester Road. It is proposed that access to the car parks and for residents will be allowed.

World Car Free Day, which is celebrated on September 22nd, encourages motorists to give up their cars for a day. Organised events, which vary by location, give motorists and commuters an idea of their locality with fewer cars.



#### **Neighbourhood Litter Picking**

The Parish Council has a selection of litter picking items for loan to residents. If you would like to organise a local litter clearance exercise around your area,

#### Tree Dedications

To preserve the rural character of our town, the Parish Council is promoting the planting of new trees in appropriate

places. If you would like to plant a tree in memory of an individual or for the anniversary of a significant event, please identify a suitable location and give details to the Parish Council office. The Tree Wardens will review the site and the recommended species before the permission of the relevant authority or landowner is obtained. The sponsor would be asked to pay for the tree and a small plaque.

#### **Priory Meadow Footpath**

If you have taken a walk around Priory Meadow recently you may have noticed the work carried out to re-surface and widen the footpath leading out of the Meadow and around the stables.

What a great improvement!

#### Local Housing for Local People

The Parish Council is looking to identify possible sites for affordable housing for local people which can all be considered for their suitability and availability.



This process will ensure that, if the parish decides to proceed with an affordable housing exception site for local people, that the right site is developed.

The Council invites landowners to submit details of their plot of land which could be purchased as planning exception scheme prices (approx. £12K per plot) either online parishclerk@bishopswalthampc.gov.uk or in person to Bishop's Waltham Parish Council.

Information that is required about the site:

- Site details
- Name and contact details of site promoter
- The name the site is known as
- Address
  - Size
- Ordnance Survey reference

No site too small!

monitoring, holding a designated cycling day and how to become more energy efficient within the Council.



## **Double Yellow Line Programming**

#### Free Street

To alleviate the current traffic congestion along Free Street, Winchester City Council is proposing to extend the double yellow lines as shown in the diagram.





#### Shore Lane

In preparation for the additional traffic that might result from the Coppice Hill development, Winchester City Council is proposing to extend the double yellow lines as shown in the diagram.

#### Hoe Road Phone Box

The BT phone box at the entrance to the Hoe Road recreation ground is to be decommissioned by BT and sold to the Parish Council for a nominal sum.

It is planned to relocate it to the town centre and refurbish it as an information point about the town, with leaflets available.

The future of the phone boxes

in St George's Square and on Beeches Hill are uncertain at present.



#### Bishop's Waltham to Botley Rail Trail

A project working group has been in existence for many years to open up the route of the old railway line as a multi-user non-vehicular recreational trail. The project is still at

the stage of negotiating the route and the land ownership issues.

## **Parish Council Surgery**

Each month, three of your Parish Councillors are available for any comments or queries that you may have as a resident or visitor to Bishop's Waltham.

The Parish Council surgeries give us a chance to find out how people feel about local issues.
