#### Right of Way Report for September 24

Footpath 43 kissing gate: The last kissing gate, funded by Southampton Ramblers for this Right of Way, has just been installed by four Ramblers volunteers. Unfortunately, a member of the public had vandalised one of the stiles on another part of the landowner's property three days before the installation was to be carried out. The landowner's cows escaped from their field and, as a result, the landowner threatened to withdraw his permission for the gate to go in. My thanks go to the Parish office staff and to Barry Nicholson for diffusing the situation. A second stile has since been vandalised and the landowner now realises that kissing gates would be more secure than his stiles which are, in fact in a poor condition. I suggest that we should use the gate that is still stored at Hoe Road Sports field here rather than at Ashton Lane near Street End Farm as I had originally intended.




Footpath 31: The site meeting at Metlands Farm, Dean, took place on 12<sup>th</sup> September with the Countryside Access team, Andy Aitken, Harry and Andrew. Three local members of the public, including our Tree Warden, Clare Grover, were invited because they have serious concerns about safety issues that would present themselves if the proposed diversion of the Right of Way was accepted, mainly because there would be restricted vision of the road in both directions. There is confusion as to the true line of the Right of Way from 1950s records and post-digitisation in the 1980s from which all present maps have been produced. The Countryside Access team will make further investigations before making any recommendation. A possibility might be to bring the Right of Way onto the road at the side of the hay barn further from Beeches Hill. At present it is on the side closer to Beeches Hill. This would give a better view of any traffic on Dean Lane but would, however, require the landowner to remove part of a newly erected wall.

**Training for Volunteers:** I hope that a training session will take place in the Jubilee Hall withing the next two months. Kate Martin, the new Engagement Officer, is working with Emma to find a suitable date. Meanwhile, one of our wardens has attended a session with volunteers from elsewhere. I understand that grants are available for purchase of power tools and for training for using them, but trained volunteers would need to be covered by Parish Council insurance and a place for storage would have to be found.

- Request for Beeches Hill lower section to be lowered from 30-20mph. To be passed to HCC.

- Concern with lorries on Beeches Hill and use of sat nav. Advice given on liaison with haulage companies or mapping services.

The footpath wardens had cleared some paths and a letter of thanks was suggested for the company of one volunteer who had provide time off for community work.

The new Engagement Officer was now in place but had not yet arranged local training sessions. The Committee offered the idea of the Jubilee Hall as a training venue if appropriate. Thanks were given to the Rights of Way Warden's Assistant for his support in footpath clearance.

## <u>Agenda Item – WCC Local Plan Regulation 18 Consultation – Parish Council Response (approved by the Planning & Highways Committee) for information only.</u>

At the Planning & Highways Committee meeting on 22.11.22 the Councillors considered the proposed responses to the draft WCC Local Plan.

The responses were approved and brief details are provided in this report. Full details are available from the Clerk to the P & H Committee.

The draft Local Plan has over 100 policies and so the Working Group (Cllrs Wood, Jones and Williams, Mr Shields) agreed priority polices for response.

These policies were:

#### 1. Policies CN1; CN2; CN3; CN4; CN5; CN6; CN7

Carbon Neutrality and Designing for Low Carbon Infrastructure.

Responses covered mitigation against climate change; energy and carbon statement; building regulations; water collection.

#### 2. Policies D1; D2: D3; D4; D5; D6; D7; D8; D9; D10; D11

High Quality Well-Designed Places and Living Well.

Responses covered Design Principles for Market Towns and Rural Villages and the Masterplan – the responses particularly referred to the need for affordable housing.

#### 3. Policies T1; T2; T4

#### Sustainable Transport and Active Travel.

Responses covered the concept of 15-minute neighbourhoods; parking for New Developments; promotion of sustainable travel modes of transport and the design and layout of parking for new developments; access for new developments.

# 4. Polices NE1; NE2; NE3; NE4; NE5; NE6; NE7; NE8; NE9; NE10; NE11; NE12; Ne13; NE14; NE15; NE16; NE17 Biodiversity and the Natural Environment.

Responses covered offsetting; open spaces; biodiversity; green links (including the Old Railway path); settlement gaps; development of leisure and recreational facilities; protection for hedgerows; inclusion of River Hamble as recognised waterway.

## 5. Policies H1; H2; H3; H4; H5; H6; H7; H8; H9; H10; H11; H12; H13; H14 Homes for All.

Responses covered the calculation of proposed number of houses within the 'buffer'; phasing of allocations on greenfield sites; development within defined settlement boundary; affordable homes; housing for essential rural workers.

#### 6. Policies BW1; BW2; BW3; BW4

Housing Allocations for Bishop's Waltham.

Responses in full:

#### **BW1** The Vineyard/Tangier Lane.

Carried forward from previous adopted Local Plan; Part developed - no further allocation.

Recommendation: no further comment.

#### **BW2** Albany Farm.

Carried forward from previous adopted Local Plan; Part developed - no further allocation.

Recommendation: no further comment.

BW3 Tollgate Sawmill.

Carried forward from previous adopted Local Plan; No development – no further allocation.

Recommendation: noted that the land has not been developed since being included in previously adopted Local Plan where is was allocated for employment/residential use.

Recommend that serious consideration is given to using the land for a replacement healthcare facility, including a pharmacy, and some residential development. The site is 2.6 hectares and has vehicular access on to Wintershill, providing the appropriate improvements are undertaken. There may also be an option for access on to the Winchester Road, this would require the installation of a suitable vehicle access and a reduction in the current speed limit to 30mph. The site could be linked to the allocations to the east and the existing settlement via the Southern Footpath/cycleway. There is access to public transport on the Winchester Road.

**BW4** Land north of Rareridge Lane - New allocation - no development before 2030.

Recommendation: this land was chosen by the Parish Council as its first choice under the SHEELA exercise (noting that this was chosen as the fourth site by the PC under the previously adopted plan) and so is welcomed by the Parish Council.

The land is currently used for growing trees (known locally as the "Christmas Tree" site) and is underdeveloped. The West Hoe Cemetery is situated to the west of the site and the South Downs National Park lies to the north and so any development will need to be carefully managed to minimise the impact on both locations.

Concern was raised over the proposal for a pedestrian crossing on Hoe Road as this would encourage pedestrians to use Hoe Road, where there is insufficient footpath and would require crossing Hoe Road twice to access the schools. A better and safer option would be to use the existing footpaths via Rareridge Lane, Free Street and the church path. See attached diagrams.

The Policy should include the requirement to utilise the existing access from Byron Close for <u>pedestrian and cycle flow only.</u>

The Working Group had concerns over the possible impact of any development on the junction of Rareridge Lane and Hoe Road. It is requested that this is assessed and proposals agreed, within the policy, to ensure that the highway is safe for vehicle, pedestrian and cycle access.

Generally welcome the proposals within this policy but would request the inclusion of a reduction in speed limits where new developments are proposed to ensure that they are suitable and that any cumulative impact on the highway is considered.
