PH97/25 **Public Session**

The member of the public raised the following points:-

- The planning application for the Esso garage site had been favourably responded to by the North Pond Conservation Group but concerns continued about the additional traffic on that stretch of the B2177 and the need for a pedestrian crossing there.
- The history boards on the Malt Lane development hoarding boards were due to be moved – location to be confirmed by Bishop's Waltham Society.
- Concern raised over people trying to cross the B3035 from the Langton Road side of town to the North Pond bridge, especially children and the elderly. A request was made for the return of a school crossing patrol person or a zebra crossing at the site. It was explained that the school crossing patrol role had been advertised without any success and due to HCC cuts, the role was not progressed. Zebra crossings were noted as very costly to HCC but this could be requested formally as a future agenda item.
- A further request to progress the idea of a town flagpole was raised with the reminder given to make a formal proposal which the Council could then actively respond to.

In addition to these points, it was noted that morale was low within some of the town traders due to the letter from HCC reminding businesses to use the designated bin store. It was felt that HCC needed to send letters to all businesses with bins on the highway i.e. Brook Street to ensure a consistent approach.

The continuing monitoring of the Accessibility project pavement works was noted.



A discouraging response from a fisherman was noted regarding the feeding of the swans on the water.

Speed surveys would be set up on approach roads on the B2177 to accurate measure traffic. The need for a pedestrian crossing was again noted for action, though high costs acknowledged. A vegetation clearance of roadside signage was to be organised to improve visibility. An update on road condition works would be provided to alleviate current holes and bumps. A reiteration of the need for bollards at the Avenue was made to address visibility concerns and encourage safe driver habits. Thanks were given for the offer of our grounds staff team for minor roadside works and signage works. Further meetings were requested to discuss concerns regarding the B3035 and the High Street lining.

While we wait to adopt the Local Plan, we are required by Government to begin the next one (as you'll know it takes many years of work to adopt a Local Plan, so early work needs to start now).

The Council is updating its Strategic Housing and Economic Land Availability Assessment (SHELAA).

A "Call for Sites" is running until **Friday 14 November 2025**. You may have already received an email about this. We are writing to all those who are on our contacts list (landowners, promoters, agents etc.) for the 2023 SHELAA, to ensure that you are aware.

Bishop's Waltham Parish Council Tree Warden

Terms of Reference – approved 26.6.18

Appointment

The Parish Council Tree Warden may be a Parish Councillor or, by resolution of the Planning Environment and Highways (PE&H) Committee, any resident of Bishop's Waltham (subject to ratification by the Council in accordance with Standing Orders).

The Tree Warden will be an ex-officio member of the PE&H Committee and will have all the rights and responsibilities reflected in Parish Council Standing Orders except the right to vote on resolutions.

Role

The Tree Warden will aim to ensure the tree heritage within Bishop's Waltham sustains the rural character of the town and the surrounds through advising the Parish Council on specific measures to take.

Tasks

- Keep all current Tree Preservation Orders (TPOs) under review and recommend any changes
- Review the landscaping plans for major development sites and recommend where TPOs should be applied
- Conduct an annual review of trees within the Conservation Area and recommend where surgery, removal, replacement or additional trees might be appropriate
- Advise the Parish Council on planning applications from property owners for the alteration of protected trees, whether in the Conservation Area or subject to TPOs
- Respond to issues raised by members of the public on protected or other significant trees
- Attend meetings of the PE&H Committee at least quarterly to report progress and to request action
- Engage with the public through submitting articles to local publications, attending Parish Council surgeries or display stands, conducting surveys or any other means as required and as time and resources will allow.

Competences

The Parish Council Tree Warden need have no formal qualifications. The individual needs to be reasonably fit, have an interest in trees and be committed to preserving the rural character of Bishop's Waltham whilst also protecting the rights of interested landowners.
